# Dr. McIntire to Speak at February Meeting

Dr. Sarah McIntire will address our branch at the February 1st meeting, discussing antibiotic resistance and asking, "Are Bacteria Winning the War?"

Dr. McIntire earned her PhD from the University of Cincinnati and received a postdoctoral fellowship at the University of Edinburgh, supported by an AAUW fellowship and the NIH. Afterward, she worked as a Research Microbiologist at the Dallas VA Medical Center.

In 1990, Dr. McIntire



came to
TWU as an
Associate
Professor of
Biology and,
since 2003,
has chaired
the Biology
Department

at TWU, teaching classes in Microbiology and Advanced Genetics. She conducts laboratory research with Helicobacter pylori, the organism that causes ulcers.

In addition, Dr. McIntire directs the Bridges to the Baccalaureate program at TWU, which encourages community college students to complete a bachelor's

degree and consider graduate work.

Dr. McIntire has also been instrumental in organizing Expanding Your Horizons, our branch's math and science career conference for middle-school girls. This year's conference will be held February 18, in the MCL building on the TWU campus.


