will be Dr. Jennifer Way of the University of North Texas. Dr. Way is Associate Professor of Art Education and Art History, Affiliated Faculty of Women's Studies, and Founding Member of IARTA art / technology research cluster.

According to her faculty profile, Dr. Way's research includes the study of ethnicity and cultural heritage in British and Irish art; the "politics of crafts in US-Vietnam relations 1954-1961"; and the nexus of art and technology in the modern world. In addition to a heavy teaching load, Dr. Way oversees research projects for MA candidates, and helps graduate and undergraduate students obtain research grants, as well as opportunities to present their research through professional publications or conferences.

Dr. Way is a recognized national and international speaker and lecturer, manuscript reviewer, and newsletter editor.
