Denton Branch Public Policy chair Patsy Roe, attended the presentation. Ms. Maatz discussed the "War on Women," policies and governmental actions which restrict women's rights, especially those involving family planning and reproductive

restrictions for women. Maatz identified these policies as part of a larger effort to limit women's power. She urged women to pay close attention to candidates' positions during election campaigns, but also to remain vigilant after the election to make sure that policies beneficial to women are enacted.
