Dr. Snider's research interests include the impact of emerging technologies on the growth and development of the young child.

Snider's presentation, information from the **57th United Nations** Commission on the Status of Women, which was held March 4-15, will be available. The theme of this CSW conclave was elimination and prevention of all forms of violence against women and girls worldwide. AAUW's research publication, Crossing the Line: Sexual Harassment at School, was the basis of a CSW panel discussion.

AAUW is growing. The membership has increased to 160,000 with 700 college and university partners.

Since the emembership initiative for undergraduates started in 2008, it has grown to 3,000 e-members, and 700 graduate students have taken advantage of the \$18.81 membership which continues through June 30, 2013. Texas has 24 college and university partner

Sen. Olympia Snow to Receive Award at Convention

For the first time in six years, AAUW will be honoring an Achievement Award winner at our <u>national convention</u>. Recently retired, <u>Sen. Olympia Snowe</u> (R-ME) was the third longest-serving woman in the history of Congress and only the fourth woman to be elected to both houses.

Senator Snowe built a reputation as one of Congress' leading moderates, and during her tenure, she cochaired the

and provided leadership in establishing
the Office of Research
